
THE UNITED REPUBLIC OF TANZANIA



An Act to amend certain Written Laws

ENACTED by the Parliament of the United Republic of Tanzania.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Written Laws (Miscellaneous Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1993.
- 2. The Written Laws set out in the first and second columns of the Schedule to this Bill are amended in manner specified opposite those laws in the third column of the Schedule.

Section 38 is amended in subsections (4) by deleting the full stop at the end of the sentence and adding immediately thereafter the following words "and upon conviction is liable to a fine not exceeding three thousand shilling or imprison to a term not exceeding one year".

Acts 1968 No. 28	Intoxicating Liquors	The second schedule is amended—
		(i) in paragraph (1) by deleting item (b) and renumbering items (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g) as (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) respectively.
		(ii) in paragraph (2) by deleting item (b) and (e) and renumbering items (c), (d), (h) and (g) as (b), (c), (d), (e) respectively.
